APICS-GFTW Education Spring 2015

2014-2015 has been an active year for education for the Greater Ft. Worth Chapter. Over the past twelve months we have conducted seven CPIM Certification Exam Review courses that included a total of seventy nine participants. These classes were conducted in the recommended sequence and provided our membership the opportunity to go through all five courses before the sequence started again.

Over the last few years individual companies have demonstrated the desirability of the CPIM credential by arranging for the series to be delivered on-site for their personnel. A few of these companies have made it possible for our membership to make it through the entire series by opening these classes up to participants outside of the host company. 2014-2015 is the first time in several years the chapter will deliver the entire series with public classes without a company host. There has been enough interest each time a class was offered to meet the minimum number of participants to "make" the class.

Surveys of participants in each class indicate the location of these classes was an important consideration in deciding to register for the class. Our chapter President, Dave Shelton, deserves much of the credit for the increased participation because he has arranged with his company, Sealed Air located centrally just south of DFW airport, to provide a facility to deliver the classes. GFTW also delivered one CSCP certification course this year that included 5 students.

GFTW has established five participants as the minimum number to conduct a class. We have had enough interest to deliver the classes in sequence but we will try to arrange for any class, in sequence or not if we have enough register. Our chapter currently has three instructors that are registered and participating in the APICS Instructor Development Program. GFTW's partnership agreement with APICS requires that we use instructors that are in the IDP.

The Terra Grande District is working with chapters to develop more instructors by offering the "Train the Trainer" course at reduced costs to get members enrolled in the program.
